Updated Guidance on the Election of the Chair

- 1. Elections shall be held for the Chair every two years.
- 2. Any ExCo member is eligible to be elected Chair and may be nominated or self-nominate. Those nominated have the right to decline.
- 3. Rotation of the Chair is encouraged. However, there is no limit to the number of terms a Chair may serve.
- 4. The requirements to serve as Chair are to:
 - a. provide vision and leadership for the TCP, drawing upon broad knowledge of the energy sector and/or socio-technical research;
 - spend the necessary time to direct and oversee the work of the ExCo Secretariat, participating in virtual Executive Steering Committee meetings lasting 60-90 minutes, held roughly every three weeks;
 - c. represent the TCP at one or two IEA meetings per year (in person or via videoconference); and
 - d. effectively manage meetings, reaching decisions by consensus wherever possible.
- 5. Nominations should be sent by email to the ExCo Secretary at least two months prior to the ExCo meeting at which the election will take place.
- 6. Chair elections will be held every other autumn, starting in 2020.
- 7. All candidates accepting nomination or self-nominating will provide a one-page description of the challenges facing the Programme and how they plan to address them.
- 8. Nominations and accompanying one-pagers will be included in the pre-meeting documentation issues prior to the ExCo meeting.
- 9. If more than one candidate is nominated, a secret ballot will be organised by the ExCo Operating Agent.
- 10. The candidate with the most votes will be elected. If there is a tie, a second vote will be held among those present and repeated until a winner emerges.

Updated Guidance on the Election of Vice-Chairs

- 1. Elections shall be held for each Vice-Chair every two years at an ExCo meeting.
- 2. Any ExCo member is eligible to be elected Vice-Chair and may be nominated or may self-nominate.
- 3. Rotation of the Vice-Chairs is encouraged. However, there is no limit to the number of terms a Vice-Chair may serve.
- 4. The requirements to serve as Vice-Chair are to:
 - a. oversee a particular aspect of the work of the ExCo Secretariat, participating in virtual Executive Steering Committee meetings lasting 60-90 minutes, held roughly every three weeks;
 - b. be willing to represent the TCP at IEA meetings in the absence of the Chair.
- 5. Nominations should be sent by email to the ExCo Secretary at least two months prior to the ExCo meeting at which the election will take place.
- 6. Vice-Chair elections will be held every two years, spread out in a way that ensures that not all positions on the Executive Steering Committee are up for election at the same time. This may mean that, occasionally, Vice-Chairs may be asked to remain in post for an additional six months before the position is put up for election.
- 7. All candidates accepting nomination or self-nominating will provide a one-page description of the challenges facing their particular aspect of the Programme and how they plan to address them.
- 8. Nominations and accompanying one-pagers will be included in the pre-meeting documentation issues prior to the ExCo meeting.
- 9. If more than one candidate is nominated, a secret ballot amongst ExCo Contracting Parties will be organised by the ExCo Operating Agent.
- 10. The candidate with the most votes will be elected. If there is a tie, a second vote will be held among those Contracting Parties present and repeated until a winner emerges.
